NOTICE OF INTENT TO ISSUE PERMITS TO CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE AND OF PROPOSED INITIAL TITLE V PERMIT PURSUANT TO RULES 212 AND 3006

This notice is to inform you that the South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) has received applications for a proposed landfill (LFG) gas to energy plant which includes an LFG treatment system, four LFG fueled internal combustion engines (ICE) and associated air pollution control (APC) systems, a regenerative gas flare, and an aqueous ammonia storage tank, at a location in your neighborhood. The South Coast AQMD is the air pollution control agency for all of Orange County and portions of Los Angeles, Riverside and San Bernardino Counties. Anyone wishing to operate, install, or modify equipment that could be a source of air pollution within this region must first obtain a permit from the South Coast AQMD. Rule 212 requires the applicant for certain projects, such as this one, to distribute and publish a public notice prepared by the South Coast AQMD prior to the issuance of permit. This notice is being distributed because of the level

of emissions from the proposed project. In addition, this notice is being published for the proposed initial Title V permit for the facility.

The South Coast AQMD has evaluated the permit applications for the following equipment and determined that the equipment will meet all applicable air quality requirements of our Rules and Regulations.

Project Description: Initial Title V permit and installation of an LFG to energy plant

This is an existing facility which currently does not have any permitted equipment or equipment that requires a Permit to Construct or Operate. The proposed LFG to Energy (LFGTE) Plant will receive LFG (a waste gas) from the Scholl Canyon Landfill and then treat and use the LFG to generate electricity. The LFGTE plant proposed the installation of four identical LFG fueled ICEs (Application Nos. 595659 to 595662) each driving an electrical generator at the site. The total generating capacity of the proposed equipment is approximately 12 MW. Each ICE will be fueled with LFG and the exhaust from each ICE will be vented to an APC system consisting of an oxidation catalyst and selective catalyst reduction (SCR) (Application Nos. 595663 to 595666). GDWP will also install a new LFG treatment system (Application No. 595667), an aqueous ammonia storage tank (Application No. 595669), and a regeneration gas flare (Application No. 595670). Our calculations show that a maximum increase of 93 pounds of volatile organic compounds (VOC), 159 pounds of Nitrogen Oxides (NOx), 928 pounds of Carbon Monoxide (CO), 88 pounds of Sulfur Oxides (SOx), and 53 pounds of particulate matter less than 10 microns (PM10) could be emitted into the air per day, on a 30-day average, from the facility in association with the operation of the above equipment.

The proposed equipment will use the best available control technology (BACT) for controlling air pollution. The LFG treatment system will remove sulfur compounds, siloxanes, and VOC from the LFG prior to combusting in the ICEs. The exhaust from each ICE will be vented to an APC system for control of VOC, NOx, CO, and SOx, reducing the emissions to comply with BACT requirements. As a result of burning LFG in each ICE and the regeneration gas flare, emissions from the proposed project also contain small quantities of air toxics. South Coast AQMD has evaluated the health risks associated with the maximum potential emissions. Using worst case conditions, our evaluation shows that the cancer risks and non-cancer chronic (long-term) and acute (short-term) health risks are below all applicable health risk thresholds in South Coast AQMD Rule 1401 - New Source Review of Toxic Air Contaminants.

The South Coast AQMD will consider all public comments and may revise the Title V permit in accordance with South Coast AQMD rules and regulations. If you are concerned primarily about zoning decisions and the process by which this facility has been sited at this location, you should contact your local city or county planning department.

Proposed Initial Title V Permit This is an existing facility applying for an initial Title V permit. As required by Title V of the federal Clean Air Act, the South Coast AQMD is proposing to issue the permits for the equipment in the form of a Title V permit. The Title V permit will contain all of the emissions limits and operating conditions, and will include requirements for monitoring, recordkeeping, mandatory reporting of any violations of permit conditions, and annual certifications by the operator that their facility is in compliance with the permit. The Title V permit will be enforceable by the South Coast AQMD, the federal government, and citizens.

The public may request the South Coast AQMD to conduct a public hearing on the proposed Title V permit by submitting a Hearing Request Form (Form 500-G) to Ms. Angela Shibata at the above South Coast AQMD address. The public hearing request must contain all the information requested on the form in order for the South Coast AQMD to determine whether or not the request is valid or if a public hearing will be held. The South Coast AQMD will hold a public hearing if there is evidence that the proposed permit is not correct or is not adequate to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements, and a hearing will likely provide additional information that will affect the drafting and/or issuance of the permit. Public hearing request forms may be obtained from the U.S. EPA reconsider the decision not to object. Petitions shall be submitted to U.S. EPA, Region 9, Operating Permits Section at 75 Hawthorne Street, San Francisco, CA 94105, within 60 days after the end of the 45-day U.S. EPA review period. The U.S. EPA review period for the above permits starts no earlier than May 23, 2023.
