

ORDINANCE NO. 188813

An ordinance adding Section 8.336 to the Los Angeles Administrative Code to establish an ex parte communication disclosure requirement for members of the Charter Reform Commission.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A new Section 8.336 is added to Chapter 28 of Division 8 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code to read as follows:

Sec. 8.336. Ex Parte Communications.

(a) An ex parte communication is a communication between any member of the Charter Reform Commission and any elected City officer or member of any elected City officer's staff regarding a matter pending before the Commission. An ex parte communication does not include any communication that takes place on the record during an official public meeting.

(b) The requirements of this Section do not apply to communications between Commission members and members of the City Attorney's Office providing legal counsel.

(c) Commissioners shall disclose any ex parte communication at the next Commission meeting following the communication. Disclosure shall include the time and date of the communication, the identity of the persons who participated in the communication, and a summary of the content of the communication. The Commission may establish procedures to implement this disclosure requirement.

Sec. 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and have it published in accordance with Council policy, either in a daily newspaper circulated in the City of Los Angeles or by posting for ten days in three public places in the City of Los Angeles: one copy on the bulletin board located at the Main Street entrance to the Los Angeles City Hall; one copy on the bulletin board located at the Main Street entrance to the Los Angeles City Hall East; and one copy on the bulletin board located at the Temple Street entrance to the Los Angeles County Hall of Records.



The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) intends to contract with a firm for construction management (CM) services for the Statewide Fire Alarm Replacements and Fire Watch project at the Substance Abuse Treatment Facility (SATF) located in Corcoran, California.  
The existing fire alarm and detection systems have reached the end of their useful life. The scope of services includes, but is not limited to, design, programming, and/or are out of compliance with the California Office of the State Fire Marshal inspection, testing and maintenance standards. The scope of services includes providing a criteria document (CD) for the removal and replacement of the existing fire alarm equipment, including but not limited to devices, control units, annunciator panels, backup power supplies, and terminal cabinets within all buildings. In addition, the scope of services also includes providing network cabling, new pathways, conduit, and cabling as required within all buildings to provide signal monitoring at both the onsite fire house and central control. It is intended for all existing, monitoring, controlling, and notification systems to be replaced, including various FLS interconnection functions to make them fully compliant and functional. Some of these repairs have been identified as critical to ongoing construction program; however, other connected components such as fire/smoke dampers, fire shutters, fire suppression, electronic supervision or control, evacuation operation will need to be evaluated for repair.

SATF originally opened in 1997. This prison consists of eight facilities: Facility A, B, C, D, E, F, G and the minimum security facility. Each facility contains three to five housing units and a main yard. The institution is comprised of a variety of housing unit types, including 270 housing units, 180-housing units, cross-tops, Level I and II dorms, a restricted housing unit, a central health services building with a correctional treatment center, and other incarcerated persons program building, ancillary warehouses and administrative buildings. As of May 2025, there are 5,413 incarcerated persons and 1,977 employees at this institution. The institution has 101 buildings; with a building area totaling 1,056,413 square feet. Most of SATF's buildings are construction types 1A, 1B, and IIB, with occupancy requirements such as I-3, B, etc.  
CDCR anticipates the budget for improvements at SATF to be approximately \$50 million.  
An executed Agreement for CM Services for this project is subject to budgetary, legislative and control agency approval and funding of the proposed project. The firm and its sub-consultants selected for the criteria phase are precluded from partnering with design build (DB) firms for these projects.

CDCR anticipates selecting a firm to provide the required services for this project with funding authorized in fiscal year 2025/2026 and concluding in fiscal year 2029/2030 assuming no budget cuts. The project is currently funded by the CDCR. The CM will provide services in the following phases: CD, design build entity (DBE) request for proposal and construction management services. The firm and its sub-consultants selected for the criteria phase are precluded from partnering with design build (DB) firms for these projects.

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CEQA Guidelines Sections 15162 and 15164, no subsequent or supplemental environmental impact report is required. The public hearing will be conducted entirely virtually and will allow for remote public comment. A CPC meeting will be held at a later date and conducted in a hybrid format with time for in-person or virtual public comment. This effort does not propose any specific development projects, but it may impact the use and development right for certain properties. An information session will take place from 5:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m., and a public hearing will follow at 5:30 p.m. The Public Hearing is a formal opportunity for the public to provide comments on the proposed actions. No decisions will be made during the public hearing. Participants may join the Public Hearing online by phone to offer testimony. In lieu of attending the Public Hearing, comments may be submitted by email to planning.sanpedro-ca@lacity.org or by hardcopy to Kristine Jegallian through March 12, 2026 at 5:00 p.m. Exhaustion of Administrative Remedies: If you challenge a City action in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence on these matters delivered to the Department before the action on this matter.
