Purpose of This Meeting
The South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) has scheduled a Public Workshop to present and solicit information and suggestions from the public on proposed amendments to Rule 1168 - Adhesive and Sealant Applications (PAR 1168), which is scheduled for a Public Hearing before the South Coast AQMD Governing Board on December 4, 2026 (subject to change).

Background
Rule 1168 - Adhesive and Sealant Applications, was adopted in April 1989 to reduce the use of volatile organic compounds (VOC) and toxic air contaminants from the application of adhesives, adhesive primers, sealants, and sealant plasters. The check-in person who manufactures, uses, sells, stores, supplies, distributes, or offers these for sale. Rule 1168 has been amended 15 times; the latest amendment was in November 2022. The amendments to *para*-chlorobenzotrifluoride (PCBTF) and *tert*-butyl acetate (t-BAC) due to being identified as having toxic endpoints by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment. The amendment also included a requirement for staff to conduct a technical check-in to assess PCBTF and t-BAC reformulation efforts. The check-in revealed that reformulation efforts were successful for all categories except roofing adhesive primers.

Objectives of Proposed Amended Rule
The objectives of PAR 1168 are to extend the PCBTF prohibition date for roofing adhesive primers to allow more time for reformulations; delay future effective VOC limits to two additional categories, one sealant category to allow more time for reformulations; include equivalent alternative reactivity-based limits for two categories; delete the exemption that allows facilities to use 55-gallons of non-compliant products per year; require manufacturers to provide a list of their distributors annually; transition reporting to recordkeeping for distributors; include a new category for battery adhesives with a longer phase out period for PCBTF; and provide clarifications, updates, deletions, and cross references to maintain consistency with other South Coast AQMD rules.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

The South Coast AQMD, as lead agency for PAR 1168, has prepared a Draft Subsequent Environmental Assessment (SEA) for the proposed project. The Draft SEA is a substantial CEQA document prepared pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15252 and in lieu of a Subsequent Environmental Impact Report. The Draft SEA is dated July 1, 2026. The Draft SEA is subject to CEQA amendments to Rule 1168, as allowed by CEQA Sections 15152, 15162, and 15385. The Draft SEA is being released and circulated for a 46-day public review and comment period from September 18, 2026 to November 3, 2026 to provide public agencies and the public an opportunity to obtain, review, and comment on the environmental analysis. Comments made relative to the analysis in the Draft SEA and responses to the comments will be included in the Final SEA.
